Our WOTM chapter is open to all lady lodge members. Our chapter meets the 4th Monday of each month at 7pm.



has a name and a story, and every story matters to God." Due to the shortage of homes, children are often placed outside of their community and moved around multiple times. "Foster the City works to surround foster families with a team of Support Friends. It can be buying them clothing, and going grocery shopping with them," she told me. "One of my goals in life, I always wanted to be a social worker. Obviously, I chose a different life path, but this is definitely where my heart is."

As I found out more about Tammy, here was another surprise. She is also "Membership Orientation" for Polka Dot Powerhouse. Their motto is "Changing the world by connecting the dots." As she explains, "It's a world-wide community of positive purpose-driven women, at every stage of their life, and where every woman is seen, valued, and celebrated (polkadotpowerhouse.com)."

But her "number one priority" is being a mom. Tammy has been a single parent since her daughter was 4. Her daughter, now a 22-year-old, is attending the University of Oregon and studying education. "Everything I do in life is all for my child, who is my world."

### Kathy Childs Youth Awareness Chairman Northern CA

## **Youth Awareness Program**



ecently, high school students from several local high schools met at our lodge to learn more about the Moose Youth Awareness Scholarship Program. At the meeting, the students learned about the program requirements and received all the information needed to compete for top Moose scholarships up to \$12,000. Students choose their own motivational topics on subjects such as bullying, doing well in school, nutrition, saving our environment, or any topic that they feel is really essential for children to know. Then they give their brief talks to three or more groups of children and submit one report on their presentation.

Last spring, a Monterey student won first place in the nation! He and his family said that he wouldn't have been able to attend college without this scholarship.

Students must submit their reports by late December. Entries are judged and the top California students will get an all-expense-paid trip to Phoenix, AZ in April where students will speak to their peers about their "Kids Talk" and compete for \$12,000, \$8,000, \$6,000, \$5,000, and \$4,000 scholarships.

Do you have connections with children between the ages of 5 to 11?

Places are needed for high school students to speak to young children, and are an essential part of helping these students win big scholarships. This can be during school or at an after-school program of any kind. Example connections could be leaders of Scouts, athletic teams, birthday parties, religious groups, or any group of elementary age children. Please give us suggestions! 
